  - Abstract and Keywords
  - Introduction

  - References
  - Pages should be within 10-25

    - *Example:* Koopmans, R., & Muis, J. (2009). The rise of right-wing populist Pim Fortuyn in the Netherlands: A discursive opportunity approach. European Journal of Political Research, 48, 642-664. https://doi.org/10.1111/j.1475-6765.2009.00846.x.
  - For Books and other monograph Format: Author, A. A., & Author, B. B. (year). Book title. Location: Publisher.
     Author, A. A., & Author, B. B. (year). Book title. Retrieved from http://www.xxxxxx
     Example: Shotton, M. A. (1989). Computer addiction? A study of computer dependency. London, England: Taylor & Francis.
  - For Patent Reference: Inventor, (year). Unique Patent Identifier. Location: Official Source
     Example: Fry, A. L. (1993). U.S. Patent No. 5,194,299. Washington, DC: U.S. Patent and Trademark Office.
  - For Website Reference: Author last name, first initial. (Date). Title of page. Host site. URL
